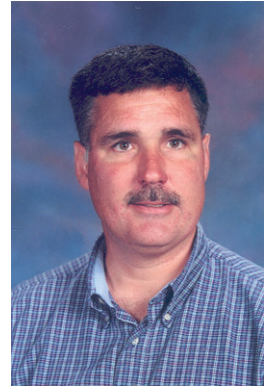

A Detailed Athletic Coaches' Manual Saves Time

One of the most useful tools for the Athletic Department at Magruder High School is the Athletic Coaches' Manual. Almost all associations including the Maryland Public Secondary School Athletic Association, counties, leagues, and various conferences, publish a handbook with specific regulations that member coaches and schools must follow. Each individual school is unique and thus has its own set of additional rules that may be different or more restrictive than those at other schools.

It is because of these differences that each coach is issued a handbook to communicate our expectations. The coaches get a copy at the pre-season staff meeting and are strongly encouraged to familiarize themselves with its contents.

Our Athletic Coaches' Manual describes the rules, policies, procedures and framework by which our Athletic Department functions. This manual is revised on an annual basis so that changes and improvements can be made as warranted. Suggestions for changes or additions can come from the Athletic Department, the Administration or the Coaching Staff. Each coach is required to sign the last page as evidence that they have read and understand the policies by which Magruder High School operates.

President Dennis Fries, the board of directors and the staff of the NIAAA in cooperation with the National Executive Directors Council and the NIAAA National Emergency Network are recommending the following programs as a means of involving our member athletic administrators, our member state athletic administrator associations and our student athletes in hurricane relief:

1. In the next two to three weeks with the assistance of the NIAAA National Emergency Network, the NIAAA office will secure a list of schools affected by hurricane Katrina in Alabama, Louisiana and Mississippi along with each schools respective athletic administrator. This list will be made available to the leadership of each state athletic administrator association. The state associations are encouraged to ask schools in their states to "Adopt a School" from this list of affected schools. The "Adopt a School" program will be a school-to-school program endorsed by the NIAAA to assist in meeting the needs of those schools that have experienced some level of hurricane damage.

2. Many of our member athletic administrators have suffered extensive personal loss including the destruction of homes and belongings. The NIAAA has established a fund at the national office to help provide some means of personal relief for those of our profession who have suffered ravages of the hurricane. NIAAA members as well as state athletic administrator associations are encouraged to contribute financially to this fund. The board will also contribute resources from the NIAAA toward this fund. The donations accumulated will then be distributed by the board of directors to our fellow athletic administrators in Alabama, Louisiana and Mississippi once communication is restored and the level of need is determined.

You will be receiving more detailed information in the coming days with regard to these two programs.

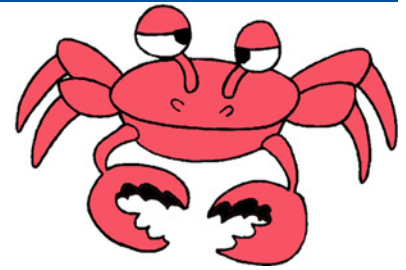

In Memoriam - Roy W. Cragway, Sr.

On Thursday, August 18, Roy W. Cragway, Sr., teacher, athletic director and coach, died of pneumonia at the age of 76.

Born and raised in Sparrows Point, Mr. Cragway graduated from the Bragg School in 1945. Majoring in health and physical education at Morgan State College, he played on the first string of the football team. Being co-captain of the team in 1948, he was named a black college All-American by the Central Collegiate Athletic Association. Mr. Cragway graduated cum laude in 1949 from Morgan State College and earned a master's degree from Teachers College at Columbia University in 1950. Serving in the army and stationed in Korea from 1950-1952, he was wounded and earned a Purple Heart and a Bronze Star. Beginning his teaching career in 1952 at Fairmont Hills Junior High School, he transferred to Frederick Douglass High School in 1955 where he taught physical education and became the department head and athletic director. While at Douglass he also coached football and basketball. In 1981, he ended his career as the school's athletic director. His wife of 52 years, Wilhelmina Reid; two sons, Dr. Roy W. Cragway, Jr. and Robert Reid Cragway; two sisters and two grandchildren survive him.
