### In Memoriam

### Douglas Aubrey Bloodsworth, Jr.

Douglas Aubrey Bloodsworth, Jr., former Supervisor of Athletics for Somerset County, passed away from leukemia on December 3, 2020. Doug was 68.

Doug was born February 22, 1952 and raised on Maryland's Eastern Shore. He graduated from Washington High School in 1970. While in high school, Doug was a member of the band and played fast pitch softball. He was an All-Star catcher and 1st basemen. He was a member of the Boy Scouts and earned the highest accomplishment of Eagle Scout. After high school, Doug attended Salisbury State College and earned his Bachelor of Science degree in 1974. In 1984, he received his Masters of Science degree from the University of Maryland Eastern Shore.

He taught the Fisheries course at J.M. Tawes Technology and Career Center for the Somerset County Public Schools from 1976-1990. He coached baseball at Crisfield High School and at his alma mater Washington High School. In 1990, he received Coach and Teacher of the Year Awards. Doug became vice principal at Crisfield High School and then vice principal at Washington High School. He later became the principal at Washington, then principal at J.W. Tawes. During his tenure in Somerset County he was appointed the Supervisor of Athletics and the Supervisor of Instruction. When Doug retired he was the Assistant Superintendent of the Somerset County Public Schools.

In his retirement, Doug was a member of the Board of Directors at the Hudson Center and a volunteer with the Somerset Ruritan Club. He remained active in athletics as well. Doug was the Secretary and Treasurer of the Bayside Athletic Conference and the Treasurer for the MPSSAA District 8. He even found time to referee basketball games.

Doug is survived by his wife, Robin, three children and four grandchildren; his mother, sister and brother.

### **Paul Lawrence Rusko**

Sadly, Paul Lawrence Rusko, former Anne Arundel County Public Schools Coordinator of Physical Education and Athletics passed away on December 16, 2020 at the age of 86.

Paul was born in Uniontown, Pennsylvania on February 13, 1934. In 1952 Paul graduated from Uniontown High School. While at Uniontown he played football and wrestled. Paul attended Lock Haven State Teachers College after serving

in the United States Army. Like in high school, Paul played fullback on the football team and wrestled in the middle weights. Paul was inducted into the Uniontown High School Hall of Fame in 2005 and in 2007, he was inducted into the Lock Haven University Wrestling Hall of Fame.

Paul's teaching, coaching and athletic administration career covered 33 years. He helped start the athletic program while he was an administrative assistant at Northeast High School in 1964-1965. He was instrumental in starting the wrestling program at Severna Park High School, where he was coaching football and track and field. In 1965, Paul was appointed the Assistant Coordinator for Physical Education and Athletics and in 1970, he became the Coordinator. As coordinator, he avidly promoted the girls' sports programs after the implementation of Title IX. He made sure there was gender equity in all aspects of the Anne Arundel County athletics program. He advocated for separate stipends and reduced workloads for the athletic directors in the county.

His passion for wrestling was so great he organized the annual Anne Arundel County Wrestling Tournament and was the director of the MPSSAA State Wrestling Tournament. He served on several other MPSSAA committees as well.

His love and work in wrestling didn't go unnoticed. In 1975, Paul was inducted into the Maryland State Wrestling Hall of Fame and the Maryland Chapter of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame. In 2005, Paul received the Maryland State Wrestling Lifetime Service Award for his contributions to the sport. Upon his retirement in 1991, he was inducted into the MSADA Hall of Fame. Today the Anne Arundel County Public Schools honor Paul, by annually presenting the Paul Rusko Award to its most Outstanding Male Athlete.

Paul and his wife, Barbara, lived on the Eastern Shore. He loved to travel, play tennis and be with his family. Besides his wife of 63 years, Paul is survived by two daughters and a son, seven grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

### Bernard Paul Walter, Jr.

Bernard Paul Walter, Jr., 78, passed away on February 5, 2021 from cancer. Bernie was a long time teacher, coach and athletic director at Arundel High School.

Bernie was born, September 3, 1942, and raised in Brooklyn Park, Maryland. While growing up in the Brooklyn Park area he played on many Little League baseball teams. He graduated from Brooklyn Park High School in 1959. While

at Brooklyn Park, he played and captained the basketball and baseball teams and was voted the Most Athletic of his graduating class. Bernie graduated with a Master's degree in Physical Education from the University of Maryland and was a three year letterman in baseball. He was the captain of Maryland's 1963 baseball team. As a graduate student in 1964, Bernie coached Maryland's freshman baseball team.

Bernie began his teaching career at Archbishop Curley High School in Baltimore City. While at Curley, he was the assistant to renowned baseball coach, Al Frank. After seven years, Bernie accepted a teaching position in physical education at Arundel High School. He was an assistant coach in football, wrestling and track and field. In 1974, Bernie was selected as Arundel's baseball coach, a position he held until 2009. Bernie's teams compiled a 609-185 winloss record, with 16 Anne Arundel County Championships, 14 MPSSAA Regional Championships and 10 MPSSAA State Championships. In 1981, Bernie became Arundel's athletic director. He created several innovative physical education programs during his tenure. In 2002, Bernie's colleagues selected him as the MSADA Athletic Director of the Year for District 5.

Besides coaching Arundel's baseball team, Bernie coached many other baseball teams as well – the Maryland Monarchs 18U, Mayo American Legion and the USA Junior National Team, that won the International Baseball Association's World Junior Baseball Championship in 1988. Bernie was also instrumental in organizing the Brooks Robinson High School All-Star Game.

After Bernie retired from education, he continued to be involved in athletics. From 2008-2011 he was the University of Maryland's Director of Baseball Operations. In 2011, he helped revive the Maryland State Athletic Hall of Fame.

Bernie's success didn't go unnoticed. He received many awards and honors along the way. He was recognized by the <u>Baltimore Sun</u> as Baseball Coach of the Year in 1975, 1981 and 1993. In 1996, he was the NFHS Baseball Coach of the Year. He was inducted into the Anne Arundel County Hall of Fame in 2001. In 2007, he was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame and the National High School Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame. And in 2017, Bernie was the only coach from the state of Maryland that has ever been selected to the NFHS Hall of Fame.

Bernie is survived by his wife of 56 years, Barbara, his daughter and son-in-law and five grandchildren.

### Dominic "Dom" Zaccarelli

On January 18, 2021, Dominic "Dom" Zaccarelli, athletic director at Westlake High School, passed away as a result of complications with Covid-19. Dom was 56 years old.

Dom was born in Lebanon, Pennsylvania on February 25, 1964. Dom's family moved to Charles County, Maryland when Dom was 10 years old settling in the LaPlata area. He played football and wrestled at LaPlata High School and graduated in 1982. While at LaPlata, Dom met his soon to be wife, Kris. They were married in the summer of 1983. Dom attended the University of Maryland and graduated with a Business Management degree. He went on to earn an Education degree in Special Education from Millersville University.

Dom worked with his father for several years at an insurance agency and began coaching football at Maurice J. McDonough High School from 1984-1991. He coached varsity wrestling at McDonough from 1988-1992. In 1992, Dom was hired as a special education teacher at Westlake High School and became the varsity football and varsity wrestling coach. In 1998, Dom was appointed the athletic director. Although he stepped down from coaching wrestling, he continued to coach football through 2012. As a football coach, Dom compiled a record of 148 wins and 34 losses. In 2008, he led his team to the Class 3A State Football Championship title and was selected the Washington Post's All-Met Coach of the Year.

Dom won numerous Southern Maryland Athletic Conference (SMAC) Football and Wrestling Coach of the Year Awards. He was inducted into the Maryland High School Football Hall of Fame in 2015 and awarded the Washington District Football Officials Association's Hobie O'Meara Award for his contributions to football.

Dom was very active not only in his school and community, but in the SMAC, as well. He served as the president; created a mentoring program; and provided NCAA and Athletic Department/Team Funding workshops. He was a member of the MPSSAA Board of Control and served on numerous committees as well as overseeing many post season playoff contests.

In 2017, at the annual MSADA Conference, Dom presented a workshop on "Marketing Your School Program". In 2001 and 2020, Dom's colleagues in his district selected him as their District Athletic Director of the Year.

Besides Kris, his wife of 37 years, Dom is survived by his three children, five grandchildren, his mother and two sisters.




