In Memoriam

Carmine Blades

Carmine Blades, student, teacher, coach and athletic director at St. Mary's High School in Annapolis, passed away on July 15, 2020 from a stroke he suffered this past May. Carmine was 84.

Carmine grew up in Annapolis. He attended St. Mary's High School and graduated in 1955. While at St. Mary's, Carmine was the boys' lacrosse team manager. He also founded the Junior Civitan Club, a club that builds good citizenship by providing volunteer clubs that serve the community.

After graduating from the University of Maryland, where he was the manager of the wrestling team, Carmine began his teaching career at his alma mater, St. Mary's High School. He taught social studies for more than 40 years.

Carmine served as St. Mary's athletic director from 1980-1998. In the early 80's, one of his early accomplishments was his petitioning to the Maryland Scholastic Association (MSA) for school membership into their association. After five years St. Mary's was accepted. While teaching and overseeing all the duties of athletic administration, Carmine coached the girls' varsity basketball team for 10 years.

After retiring in the early 2000's, Carmine continued to serve St. Mary's by substitute teaching and attending and supporting all the teams.

Carmine was a member of the Knights of Columbus and a communicant of his church, St. John Neumann Catholic Church.

Carmine was inducted into the St. Mary's High School Hall of Fame in 1994. In 2000, he was honored as a St. Mary's Distinguished Alumni and he received the James F. "Cork" Kimball Award from the Royal Blue Club in 2010.

Besides his school, Carmine was very active in the MSADA. He was the District 8 Representative from 1990-1998. He was selected the 1992 District 8 Athletic Director of the Year by his peers and in 2001, Carmine was inducted into the MSADA Hall of Fame.

George Charles Edward Masood

George Charles Edward Masood "Ed" passed away on November 2, 2020.

Ed grew up in Altoona, Pennsylvania and graduated from Altoona High School in 1961. While at Altoona, Ed played football and baseball and wrestled. Ed was a two time

finalist at the Western Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic League and the Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association District 6 Wrestling Championships.

After high school, Ed attended Lock Haven State College earning a Bachelor of Science Degree in Health and Physical Education. While attending Lock Haven, Ed played football and wrestled. The wrestling teams were three time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference champions and two time National Association of Interscholastic Athletics champions. In addition, Ed earned a Master's of Science Degree from Frostburg State College and a Master's in Business Administration from American University. He earned his Doctorate in Education from George Washington University, as well.

Ed began teaching and coaching in 1965. He taught at Montgomery Blair High School and Richard Montgomery High School, respectively. He was an assistant football coach while at three schools and an assistant wrestling coach at Paint Branch. He was the varsity wrestling coach for three years at Montgomery Blair and three years at Richard Montgomery.

Ed served as the assistant athletic director at Montgomery Blair from 1965-1968 and at Richard Montgomery from 1971-1973. In 1973, he was appointed the Supervisor of Health and Physical Education and Athletics for the Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS). In 1976, he became the Director of the MCPS Department of Aesthetics, Health and Physical Education and Athletics. Besides overseeing the health and physical education curriculum and the athletic programs, Ed was responsible for the landmark Gender Equity in High School Athletics study.

In June 2003, Ed retired from the MCPS. However, Ed didn't stay retired for long. In July, 2003, he was selected as the Supervisor of Arts, Health and Physical Education and Athletics for the Washington County Public Schools (WCPS). He retired from WCPS in June, 2010. In both counties, he not only oversaw the athletic programs, but Ed promoted professional growth and development for the athletic directors, he encouraged them to become members of their professional organizations, take leadership training courses and become certified.

All through his years in education, Ed was part of the advancement of wrestling. He officiated over 60 high school district, regional and state wrestling championships and more than 40 NCAA Division I, II and III regional and national wrestling championships. He was a member of the MPSSAA Wrestling Committee for 20 years and he

was one of the co-founders of the MPSSAA high school wrestling championships. He served as a Wrestling Rules Interpreter for not only Maryland, but for Delaware and the District of Columbia, as well. He served on the NFHS Wrestling Committee for two years. He was a member of the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors for the Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling Officials Association, the National Wrestling Association and the Big Ten Wrestling Officials Association.

In his community, Ed served as the Youth Sports Program Commissioner for the Montgomery Village Sports Association. He helped increase the number of sports opportunities for the boys and girls in his community.

In 1985, Ed was recognized for his wrestling contributions, by being inducted into the MPSSAA State Wrestling Hall of Fame. In 2011, Ed was awarded the State Lifetime Service to Wrestling Award by the Maryland Chapter of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame.

Ed has been a member of the MSADA since 1976 and attended the MSADA conferences regularly. Even after retiring, Ed was always present at the conferences. In 2011, Ed was inducted into the MSADA Hall of Fame.

We thank Carmine and Ed for their service to the coaches and students in Maryland. They both will be greatly missed.


Fredrica Newman is the new athletic director at Concordia Preparatory School. Fredrica was at the now closed Institute of Notre Dame.

Construction of the "Eagle Dome" at Indian Creek School is underway and will be finished in November 2020. This dynamic facility will provide an air-supported enclosure over four existing tennis courts, creating 26,000 additional square feet of indoor space for the campus and serve as a year-round athletic facility. It will be surfaced with all-purpose sport flooring that will be lined for tennis, basketball, volleyball and other sports. The Eagle Dome will be heated and air-conditioned which will allow indoor sports, as well as outdoor sports, to practice when the weather is not favorable.

The John Carroll School hosted a groundbreaking ceremony to officially kick off construction of a brand new baseball

facility to be named Alumni Field at Kutcher Foundation Stadium. This project was made possible through a generous grant - the largest in the history of the school - from the Kutcher Foundation, a Harford County-based private operating foundation. The Kutcher Foundation funding will support creative learning spaces both on and off the field, with unique programs and educational experiences in the fields of computer science, data analytics, and sports journalism. The centerpieces for these initiatives will include a state-of-the-art Innovation Center and a collegiate-caliber baseball facility that will serve as real-world laboratories for innovative curricula in STEAM, data science, and media studies. Initial renovations are already complete for the Innovation Center, and work will begin soon on the new baseball facility which should be ready for play this spring. The field is a synthetic surface and will include new dugouts and fencing. The design calls for a removable mound and adjustable bases to support use by the school's softball team as well as the baseball team. Future phases will include equipping the facility with sports analytics and broadcasting equipment to help launch innovative educational classes to prepare students for modern careers in media, math, and science.

The John Carroll School President Steve DiBiagio says, "The Kutchers and the Kutcher Foundation have given John Carroll and its students an opportunity of a lifetime. We are beyond grateful for their generosity, their kindness, and their strong faith in the future of our young people."



Member Liability Insurance

The NIAAA provides each regular member excess liability coverage for their duties as athletic administrators, athletic directors, coordinators or supervisors up to \$2,000,000. Excess means coverage beyond any liability coverage through member's employer, and any additional personal liability coverage held. This liability insurance covers the members for claims or lawsuits involving bodily injury of an athlete (spectator or participant) involving negligence charged on the part of the directors of athletics, or property damage to a third party. This liability policy does not cover lawsuits for such claims as discrimination, wrongful suspension of a coach or athlete, harassment, personal dismissal, coaching, teaching or principal duties, or any other claim not involving bodily injury or property damage. Suits for such claims occurring during the course of employment would have to be covered by the employer.
