In Memoriam

Morgan B Wootten



Morgan B. Wootten, teacher, coach and athletic director at DeMatha Catholic High School passed away on January 21, 2020 at the age of 88.

Morgan was born on April 21, 1931 in Durham, NC. Morgan's family moved to Maryland and he grew up in the Silver Spring area. He attended Gonzaga College High School in Washington, DC, before transferring to Montgomery Blair High School in Silver Spring. After graduating from high school in 1951, he attended Montgomery Junior College and then transferred to the University of Maryland. While in college, Morgan was an amateur boxer and coached basketball at the St. Joseph's Home and School for Boys, an orphanage in Washington, DC. In 1953, while still attending

college he coached football and basketball at St. John's College High School in DC. Morgan graduated in 1955 from the University of Maryland with a bachelor's degree in physical education and history. In 1956, Morgan was hired by DeMatha Catholic High School in Hyattsville as a teacher, coach and athletic director. It was there the legacy began.

While at DeMatha, Morgan taught world history to every freshman through 1980 and always stressed success in the classroom first. He coached football for 11 years and compiled a 79-40-2 record. But it is basketball that he is known for. Besides the 1274 wins and 192 losses, every senior for 31 straight years went on to play college basketball. Many of those same players continued on to a professional basketball career as well.

With five national championships, Morgan was recognized as one of the most successful and outstanding coaches in the country. He was highly thought of by such coaches as UCLA's John Wooden and the Boston Celtics coach, Red Auerbach. Morgan was offered many opportunities to leave high school coaching and coach at many prestigious colleges and universities. But, his family came first and his heart was always at DeMatha.

Morgan retired in 2002 after 46 years at DeMatha. Before retiring, however, he received many honors and accolades. In 1984, he was selected as High School Coach of the Year by *USA Today*. He received the Walt Disney Teacher/Coach of the Year Award in 1991. In 2000, he was the third high school coach to be inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame located in the home of basketball, Springfield, MA. Also in 2000, he was named the Naismith Scholastic Coach of the Century. Today, the Hall of Fame's Morgan Wootten Lifetime Achievement Award is presented annually to the most outstanding boys' and girls' high school coaches.

Morgan is survived by his wife of 55 years, Katherine; five children; two sisters and a brother.

Congratulations, Coach Robert Youngblood!

The Maryland State Coaches Association (MSCA) along with the Maryland State Athletic Directors Association (MSADA) would like to congratulate Robert Youngblood, of Northwest High School, in Montgomery County, for being named the 2018/19 National Federation of High School Sports (NFHS) Mideast Boys and Girls Outdoor Track and Field Coach of the Year. Coach Youngblood was selected for this award out of eight states which include Delaware, District of Columbia, Kentucky, Maryland, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and West Virginia.

Coach Youngblood has been the head coach of the Northwest Jaguars Boys and Girls Outdoor Track and Field team since 2012. In those seven years his teams have accomplished the following; seven Maryland Public Secondary Schools Athletic Association (MPSSAA) state championships, 12 MPSSAA regional championships (six by the boys and six by the girls), seven Montgomery County Boys championships and six Montgomery County Girls championships. Coach Youngblood served as head coach at Damascus High School prior to Northwest where his teams won; three MPSSAA state championships, five MPSSAA regional championships and two Montgomery County championships.

In addition to this award, Coach Youngblood has received the following accolades:

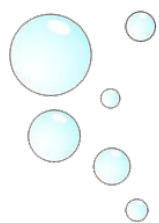

Coach Youngblood has been an educator and coach in the Montgomery County Public Schools for 15 years. The impact that Coach Youngblood has had on his student-athletes goes beyond their four years they have had him as a coach in high school. Coach Youngblood is dedicated to making his student-athletes better on and off the playing surfaces and he goes above and beyond to help and support them anyway he can.

Hard to believe that we are into 2020 and winter sports season is more than halfway over. Before you know it, it will be spring season and warmer weather. I wish all the winter coaches and student-athletes a strong finish to the season and all the spring coaches and student-athletes a spectacular beginning to their season.

We are excited to announce that Robert Youngblood, of Northwest High School in Montgomery County was selected as the Boys and Girls Mideast Outdoor Track and Field NFHS Coach of the Year for the 2018-19. An official press release is included in this edition of the MSADA newsletter. Congratulations, Coach Youngblood, we are very fortunate to have you as a coach in Maryland.

The MSCA also issues \$100 reimbursements to members who follow the steps below for earning their AIC or CIC certification through the National Federation. We issue 20 AIC per year and 20 CIC per year. As of 10/13/2019 we have given out 3 AIC reimbursements (17 left for 2019-20 membership year) and 1 CIC reimbursement (19 left for 2019-20 membership year). It is important that ADs and coaches know and understand the policies which can be found in the below.

Reimbursement Criteria for AIC and CIC

- Join the NFCA and MSCA
- Receive your membership card (This will come in the mail with a letter about 35 days after your membership is inputted into the system)
- Earn your AIC or CIC. You are eligible for one AIC reimbursement and one CIC reimbursement. However, you may only earn one reimbursement per membership year.
- Your AIC or CIC certificate must be dated after (when you receive your letter there will be a date in a blank of when your certificate must be dated by) in order to be eligible for a reimbursement.
 - If your county accepts Care and Prevention as a replacement for First Aid, Health and Safety, please see below - **Using C & P for First Aid, Health and Safety**
 - **You can enter this into the NFHSlearn.com portal (see below)**
 - **1 of the courses needed for AIC or CIC MUST BE COMPLETED AFTER you become a member of the NFCA/MSCA for that membership year**
 - **Example for AIC:**
 - **Care and Prevention (taken before member of NFCA/MSCA)**
 - **Concussion in Sport (taken before member of NFCA/MSCA)**
 - **Fundamentals of Coaching (taken before member of NFCA/MSCA)**
 - **Sport specific course (taken after you become a member of NFCA/MSCA and after you receive letter in mail with date)**
- Once you earn your AIC or CIC, you must send your certificate that you can download from the NFHS website once you complete your certification to Lisa Magness at coachmags24@icloud.com
- Lisa Magness will then make sure you are a member and check with the NFHS to make sure you did complete your AIC or CIC. Once that is cleared and approved, the MSCA treasurer will send a \$100 check made out to you to your school's Athletic Director. Lisa Magness will send you an email stating the status of your reimbursement.
- Begin using the AIC or CIC after your signature ☺
- All requests for reimbursements MUST be sent to Lisa Magness via email by May 15, 2020 at 11:59pm. Reimbursements after this date will not be granted.
- **It is encouraged that you email Lisa Magness, coachmags24@icloud.com with ANY questions before you start any courses to make sure you understand all the procedures and you understand what is needed for you to earn the reimbursement.**

Please note, only 20 AIC Certifications and 20 CIC Certifications per year will be reimbursed. However, at any time, reimbursements may not be accepted or granted due to unforeseen circumstances.

Using C&P for First Aid, Health and Safety

- Have coaches log into their NFHSLearn.com portal
- Have coaches click on Dashboard. This is up at the top and the first one.
- Have coaches click on the My National Certification. This on the left hand side and is the third one down.
- Have coaches then click under the AIC Certification where it says show requirements.
- Under First Aid, Health and Safety, have coaches click on view exemptions.
- Have them click the following:
 - I am exempt
 - Under exempt courses, select Care and Prevention of Athletic Injuries (Maryland)--
please note this has to have been completed within the last 3 years
- Have them enter the date they took it and the location
- Have them select "select exemptions"
- Once they hit that, it will show that they completed the course as Care and Prevention of Athletic Injuries (Maryland)

This course is a companion course to Strategies for Organizational Management and outlines an approach to the fundamentals and methods of athletic administration and alerts and educates athletic administrators regarding potential problems and possible solutions in areas such as special events, public relations, awards, fundraising and Booster Clubs. The course also touches upon ways to increase or improve citizenship and sportsmanship through positive initiatives. Athletic Administrators will have a hands-on experience creating handbooks and a strategic plan for their school. Required for: RAA, RMSAA, CAA and CMAA Certification. [NEW 2016]

LTC 504 - Legal Issues I (Liability for Sports Injuries and Risk Management)**\$ _____**

This course provides in-depth coverage of the legal standards governing liability for sports injuries, including the duties imposed by courts and legislatures on athletics administrators, coaches, athletic trainers, and other athletics personnel related to safeguarding the health and well-being of student-athletes and other persons in school sports environments, along with strategies for developing, implementing, and documenting an effective risk management program for interscholastic athletics. Required for: CAA, RMSAA and CMAA Certification. [REVISED 2016]

LTC 620 - Concussion Assessment and Management and the Steps for Proper Fitting of Athletic Protective Equipment**\$ _____**

This course examines the role of the Athletic Administrator and other school administrators in supporting the use of the three principle P's – proper preparation of athletes for participation; the principles of concussion awareness and management, and proper steps for fitting of athletic protective equipment. Part I: preparation for participation: This includes having a proper athletic inventory of protective equipment; a description of the PPE (pre participation evaluation form) and neurological testing. Part II: consists of principles of concussion awareness and management; Part III: proper steps for fitting of all protective athletic equipment. [REVISED 2016]

Friday, April 24th 8:00am – 12:00 noon**LTC 506 - Legal Issues II (Title IX and Sexual Harassment)****\$ _____**

This course provides in-depth coverage of the legal standards governing the authority of schools to sanction student-athletes and athletics personnel for misuse of electronic communications tools and inappropriate postings on social media, including strategies for developing and implementing effective social media policies, along with extensive coverage of the legal mandates imposed by courts and legislatures related to event management and security, legal issues regarding the participation by transgender students in school sports programs, the rights of pregnant and parenting student-athletes that must be respected by interscholastic athletics programs, and the intellectual property issues related to schools sports nicknames, logos, and mascots. Required for CAA and CMAA Certification.

LTC 630 - Interscholastic Contest Management - Planning, Preparation and Methods**\$ _____**

This course examines the historic foundations and precedents for contest management as an extension of educationally sound sports programs. Planning methods for contest management are examined including selection of supervisory personnel, suggested need assessment tools, and checklists for the development of supervision plans and policies. In addition, an overview of methods is suggested for creation of an educationally sound competition environment among players, coaches, students and other spectators. The course emphasizes the need for flexible plans and responses to various contest situations and contingencies. [REVISED 2014]

LTC 726 - Student Leadership Development**\$ _____**

Student Leadership Development is an essential component to any successful education-based athletic program. In this course will be covered numerous ways to actively develop leaders in your local school and at the state level. Topics that will be covered include: captains council, student leadership workshops, service learning, and local and statewide student summits. The society in which we live is ever-changing and so are our student-athletes resulting in a necessity to evolve in finding new ways to teach and challenge students to be the next generation of leaders. Enrollees that will derive the greatest benefit include educators who seek ideas and materials to help develop student leadership in their respective school, state and nation. [NEW 2017]

Saturday, April 25th 8:00am - 12:30pm**LTC 706 - Coaching Coaches to be Leadership and Educators****\$ _____**

This course will examine the training, preparation and guiding of coaches to understand and inherent tasks related to education-based athletics is an ongoing role and responsibility of the athletic administrator. The athletic administrator will be better prepared to integrate new learning opportunities for coaches, through the nurturing of suggested coaching knowledge, skills, behaviors, and attitudes. Enrollees in this course will be better empowered as the athletic administrator, to deal with the constant turnover and training of coaches that can demand much of the administrator's time.
