



#### LTC 619 – The Power of Curb Appeal

This course highlights areas which the athletic administrator should consider prior to hosting visiting schools, spectators, and participants for athletic events. The opinion of a school, the community, and the school's administration are often formed based on first impressions experienced when attending an athletic event. These impressions/experiences are built upon not only the visual appearance of the facility, but the overall preparedness of the facility from entering the main gate, sitting in the stands, and leaving upon completion of the event. The course discusses the power of being prepared and how communications can enhance the fans overall game experience. Strategies, methods, and illustrations will provide for maintaining structures through a comprehensive study of best operational management practices geared toward an enjoyable fan experience. (REVISED 2022)

# LTC 723 – Administration of Professional Growth Programs for Interscholastic Athletic Personnel \$\_

Providing continual professional development and education for coaches is one of the 14 legal responsibilities of athletic administrators, therefore creating a need to ensure that all coaching staff at all levels are trained at the highest level. This course will show athletic directors how to further continuing efforts. Professional development should be based upon the National Standards for Sport Coaches and would include individual school-sponsored programs, state association requirements and professional providers such as the National Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association (NIAAA) Professional Development Academy, the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) Coach Education program and the American Sport Education Program (ASEP). # LTC 705 – Coach Centered Educational Athletics – A Character Based Coach to Coach Mentoring Program \$\_\_\_\_\_

Character based coach to coach mentoring programs utilize the talents, strengths and qualities of the entire team of coaches to maximize the potential of the coaching staff. Mentoring is an attitude, a relationship, and an investment which provides coaches the opportunity to support and nurture each other professionally, personally, and ethically. This course will highlight mentoring models that demonstrate key behaviors to implement when establishing an effective coach mentoring program. It will also provide athletic administrators strategies and methods to develop and enhance successful coach to coach mentoring programs. (REVISED 2020)

# CRAB TALK!



### DISTRICT 1A

(Allegany, Garrett and Washington Counties)

If all goes as planned, Smithsburg High School athletes will be competing on a new turf field in 2023. The project has been talked about for more than a decade, according to a booster club leader. The boosters have raised most of the money themselves for the \$2.8 million project. The overall vision is a three-phase project to improve not just the field, but the associated buildings and outdoor practice facilities. The first phase will remove the grass field and install a new drainage system and turf field. The first phase also includes expanding the track from seven lanes to the standard eight lanes. In addition, the scoreboard will be moved to a more suitable location.

### DISTRICT 3

(Prince George's County)

Dr. Monica Goldson, Prince George's County Public Schools (PGCPS) Chief Executive Officer plans to retire at the end of the school year after 32 years in education. Dr. Goldson was a1986 graduate from Potomac High School in Oxon Hill. Goldson began her career as a Suitland High School mathematics teacher and cheerleader coach and eventually became a principal, associate superintendent, deputy superintendent and interim chief operating officer prior to her appointment as CEO in mid-2018.

The PGCPS hosted a groundbreaking ceremony this past June on a full replacement of Suitland High School. Suitland, built in 1951, has an existing 344,875-square foot campus which includes the high school, the Center for Visual and Performing Arts (CVPA), and Career Technical Education (CTE) programs. Enrollment is approximately 2,500 students. The new 389,108-square foot school campus is expected to open in 2026, serving an estimated 2,000 students, including 500 CVPA students. The new facility will house the high school and the CVPA programs only. The CTE programs will be relocated to Crossland High School starting this fall, which will be designated as the new southern CTE hub.

### DISTRICT 5

(Anne Arundel and Howard Counties)

Wilde Lake High School welcomes new Athletics and Activities Manager (AAM), Brandon Lauer. Brandon was previously the AAM at River Hill High School before taking sabbatical leave to complete his doctorate degree. Welcome back, Dr. Lauer.

The Howard County Public School System will announce the name of High School #13 on February 9<sup>th</sup>. The new school is located in Jessup and will open at the beginning of the 2023/24 school year.

### DISTRICT 9

(Baltimore City)

New Era Academy will be closing at the end of the school year.

### DISTRICT 10

(IAAM)

In November, the IAAM held a workshop on mental health and the student-athlete. It was led by the organization, **Morgan's Message**. The vision of Morgan's Message includes, amplify stories, resources and expertise to strengthen the student-athlete's mental health, build a community by and for athletes through peer-to-peer conversations and provide a platform for advocacy. Athletic Directors, Assistant Athletic Directors, Athletic Trainers from both the IAAM and MIAA were invited to attend this 30-minute Zoom Session.

During the IAAM's Annual Leadership Conference, the league had the opportunity to recognize and honor Fran Trumbo, Executive Director of the Baltimore Board of Officials for Women's Sports. Fran, a long-standing member of the high school sports community and true partner to the IAAM, was thrilled to be acknowledged and thanked.

### DISTRICT 10 AND 11

(IAAM and MIAA)

In February, 2023, the IAAM (District 10) and the MIAA (District 11) will partner to "Thank-A-Ref". The IAAM and MIAA will team up at Miss Shirley's Restaurant in Roland Park to provide a "Thank You" breakfast for the administrators of the 16 officials groups, that the two leagues work with each year. The event is sponsored by Five Star and Mark Burdett. The two leagues will offer an awesome breakfast and a great appreciation for all that the officials do over the course of the year, as well as the opportunities they provide for our student-athletes. This effort will be in concert with each school who will, hopefully, craft a "Thank You" to officials in their own way during the winter and spring seasons.

Excess means coverage beyond any liability coverage through member's employer, and any additional personal liability coverage held. This liability insurance covers the members for claims or lawsuits involving bodily injury of an athlete (spectator or participant) involving negligence charged on the part of the directors of athletics, or property damage to a third party. This liability policy does not cover lawsuits for such claims as discrimination, wrongful suspension of a coach or athlete, harassment, personal dismissal, coaching, teaching or principal duties, or any other claim not involving bodily injury or property damage. Suits for such claims occurring during the course of employment would have to be covered by the employer.
